

Following is a list of the items charted and a little explanation of each.

Unique Words - are words found only once in our verses of study. While this list is not meant to be all inclusive, these are generally key words that will help the quizzer to identify a verse more quickly and thus help to interrupt sooner. Lists are provided both in alphabetical order and in the order that the verses are learned. These lists are useful for associating words to a single verse, thus being able to identify that verse, and hopefully interrupt earlier. Once all of the material is learned, the alphabetical list is a good one to use for location types of drills and reinforce the association of a particular unique word to a single verse.

Repeated Phrases - are listed in the order that the verses appear in our study. These are helpful in identifying potential Cross Reference types of questions.

Repeated Words - similar to repeated phrases, but much more comprehensive. The repeated words are listed in the order they appear in the study material and are also sorted alphabetically by the number of occurrences. The key is for the quizzer to identify the things that will be helpful in "patterns" that may be used in Cross Reference questions without getting too bogged down in the details and trying to memorize the charts.

People by Name, Groups of People, Geographical Locations, Body Parts, Animals - are listed alphabetically. Scripture references are in biblical sequence.

Numbers - are listed in ascending order and include scripture references listed in biblical sequence.

Questions and Exclamations - are listed in biblical sequence and also verse sequence (all questions found in verse 1 of a book and chapter, all questions in verse 2, etc.). Stars in left hand column indicate more than 1 question contained in that verse.

Alpha Verse List - useful to determine at what point a verse becomes unique in being able to differentiate for Quotation Completion questions.

Ending Phrases - verses are sorted alphabetically from the end of the verse. This is useful to determine verses that conclude with the same or similar words or phrases
